To be accepted into the Humanities Academy students must meet rigorous course expectations as well as be enrolled in Honors and Advanced Placement social studies and English courses. These high-level courses allow students to think creatively and critically, to reason, and to ask questions. These skills allow students to gain new insights into the human experience, adding to their knowledge about our world. Students who complete the Humanities Academy will receive recognition at commencement and on their transcript and will be well prepared to continue their study of the Humanities at the university level.

- Earn a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA.
- Complete the minimum number of required courses in the approved Humanities course curriculum.
- Earn at least a 3.0 or higher in each semester of each approved course in Humanities course curriculum.
- Take the AP exam for each AP class taken in categories 2 and 3 listed below.
- Complete four Humanities Experiences from the Extra-Curricular and Community Involvement List below.
- Complete three Leadership Activities from the Extra-Curricular and Community Involvement List below.
