- Research colleges and technical schools: Use information from Naviance, <u>www.naviance.com</u>, the College Handbook (in the counseling office), <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>, <u>www.fastweb.com</u>, and college websites to find out which colleges and/or technical schools offer programs that interest you.
- Visit at least three or more college campuses this spring and summer:
 - Each student can miss school for two school-approved college visits. This counts as an approved excused absence. You will need to go to the office and fill out the *Request for Planned Absence form* prior to your visit.
 - > Schedule the visit with an Admissions Office on the college website or call the admissions office.
 - Ask to meet with an advisor in your field of interest. It is a great way to gain information about their programs and classes.
 - ➤ Currently, many colleges are offering virtual campus tours. Plan to do this as a first step, and then schedule an in-person visit when the campus opens up.
- Apply to at least 4 colleges in the early fall of your senior year:
 - ➤ **Application Deadlines**: All applications should be completed and submitted between mid-August and November of your senior year.
 - **Teacher recommendations**: Please give teachers at least 2 weeks to complete these.
 - Transcripts: Requests transcripts Parchment. https://www.parchment.com/log-in/ Mr. Nelson (mnelson@lhsa.com) sends out all transcripts. Submit the counselor forms to him as well.
- Volunteer or gain employment: in your field of interest to gain more experience and have more quality material to use on your college admission applications. - JOY Hours - 20 hours/ vear
- **Career information:** Job shadow a professional in your chosen career.
